and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following. Whereas my son Moses Wooster the younger
now doth and for some years past has received the rents produce
and profits of an Estate at Widmore End in the parish of Sluggendon
in the said County of Bucks which belongs to me during my
life now I do hereby give and bequeath unto my said son Moses
the said rents and profits which he already hath or at any time
hereafter during my life shall receive of and from the said
estate. Also I give and bequeath unto my said son Moses
the sum of five pounds to be paid him within a month after
my ~~death~~^{decease} by my Executor herein after named to buy him
new wine. Also I give and devise all three my two messuages
& tenements in Chepping Wycombe in the County aforesaid
wherein Thomas Walker Butcher and Edward Burton

Fishmonger do now severally dwell with their and every of their

appoyntments unto my Son Timothy Wooster and to his

heirs and assigns for ever Subject notwithstanding to the

incumbrances now due thereon A. 10. I give and bequeath

unto my Daughter Ann the Wife of William Dix of Chesping

Wycombs aforesaid Taylor the sum of twenty pounds to be paid

her by my said Executor within one year next after my

decease without the controul or intermeddling of her said
Husband and do direct that her own receipt shall be a proper
and sufficient discharge to my Executor for the same. Also all
the rest and residuo of my stock household goods Chattels bills
bonds notes ready money and personal Estate whatsoever
and wheresoever after payment and satisfaction of all my
just Debts legacies herein before bequeathed and funeral
expences, I give and bequeath unto and amongst my Wife
Mary Wooster and my sons Aaron Wooster the younger
and Joseph Wooster, equally to be divided between them Shares
and Shares alike by my Executor hereinafter named and I do
hereby declare that the third part of the residuo of my said
personal Estate so given to my said Wife as aforesaid shall be
in lieu and full satisfaction of all ^{with} Wives or dower as she my
said Wife ~~may~~ might otherwise claim out of any of my lands
tenements or freehold Estate And lastly I do nominate and
appoint my Nephew Aaron Wooster of the Temple Farm in
Chopping Wycombe aforesaid full and sole Executor of this
my last Will and Testament and also Guardian and Trustee
of my said Son Joseph till he shall attain the age of twenty

on 29th Jan and do hereby revoke all Wills whatsoever by me

at any time heretofore made and published In Witness

Whereof the said Moses Wooster the Testator hath hereunto
set my hand and Seal the twenty first day of July in the Year of
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Sixty Six
